

Meeting Notes from Tautoko Network Meeting

August 2023

PACE: Professional and Community Engagement Programme, University of Canterbury

Thanks to those who joined us to find out more about the University of Canterbury's PACE programme at this month's *Tautoko Network* session.

For those who couldn't make it, here's a few points of interest:

- Who are the students involved? The students have all done at least one year's study already;
- Why consider getting involved with this programme? For the organisation to get a <u>project</u> done! For the students, it's a chance to work alongside an organisation, pick up 'soft skills' such as resilience, team work, communication, confidence; workplace experience;
- Students' expectations? To make a difference, do something 'meaningful'; have a work-integrated learning experience;
- Process/Timing: There are three intakes, February, July and November. (The November intake runs in two blocks one before the summer break, and the other after.) For the intakes, processing begins in November (for February), April (for July) and September (NOW!!), for November.
- What to think about? setting up for success; the support you give the intern will enable you
 to get the most out of the process for both yourself and the intern; the PACE team can help
 you to 'package' your project.
- Where do the students come from? Although this programme initially started with Arts students, it is now offered across the University.
- Is working with an organisation all the students do for this programme? No the students will attend weekly lectures which complement the project they are working on with an organisation.
